distinguished organologist, curator and author. During his illustrious career in organology Dr Heyde worked first in Leipzig, later moving to the United States where, after working in Pottstown and Vermillion, he finally joined the staff of the Musical Instrument Department of the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York. In 1991 he was awarded the Curt Sachs Award by the American Musical Instrument Society. His extensive publications in the field of organology include books on the flute and brass instruments in Leipzig Museum of Musical Instruments which set new standards for such works. He has provided notable articles for the Journals of the major organological societies. He can probably be considered the most highly respected and productive scholar working in the field of organology today.
